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THE SCHOOL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

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The school provides an opportunity where we can learn a lot of skills that are needed. Children as young as three years old are taught how to read and write at their preschools. They begin to learn the alphabet, numbers and even do algebra with some fundamental problems. They will have the opportunity to exercise their talents in drawing, building, problem-solving, and cognitive skills. School is also more fun for friends to hang out with (Teaching Job, 2014).

Natividad (2019), the school is a virtual after-home environment for children to spend a lot of time on psychological, educational, and physical aspects. Each day of school, the student will be in many fields, such as playgrounds, the art center, and the chemistry laboratory. That means that health and satisfaction issues will be taken over by air quality, construction materials, water quality, and chemical use. A secure physical climate leads to a favorable learning environment for children and greater efficiency for teachers and staff. The preservation of a safe school atmosphere is therefore vital to students' progress in achieving optimal educational results. A healthy school environment also helps kids grow in a balanced way that will build a cheerful child's personality and become influential people in the community.

A critical factor for students, staff, and visitors' general health and safety is the physical condition of school buildings and school grounds. To be free from health and safety risks and encourage learning, school buildings and grounds must be planned and maintained. Many studies have shown that the school climate or environment can positively or negatively influence student success. Policies and protocols must be in place



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to ensure food, protection, sanitation, safe water supply, healthy air quality, good lighting, safe playgrounds, prevention of violence, and emergency response, among other issues relating to the physical environment of schools (New Hampshire Department of Education, 2019).

The physical environment alludes to the physical qualities and features of the room. The classroom's physical environment is a mixture of different items, i.e., temperature, lighting, room size, ventilation, walls, floor, seats, mats, whiteboards, PCs, etc. The primary components of the classroom situation are considered to be teachers and learners. Stimulating the physical environment has a critical, constructive effect on the productivity of any association. It acts as a catalyst to provide a straightforward approach to achieving the prearranged organizational objectives (Suleman and Hussain, 2015). A healthy school climate promotes students' attendance, a factor that helps remedy many school woes. It also allows teachers and students to relieve tension and boosts a more optimistic outlook for those involved. Some research also shows that the school environment is a crucial factor in students' success and the retention of teachers (Education Dive, 2020).

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
