OFFICIAL STATEMENT On the Comments of Senator Manny Pacquiao on Corruption in the Department

May 8, 2022 - In an interview in the KBP-COMELEC PiliPinas Forum 2022 aired last May 6, the Honorable Senator Manny Pacquiao alluded to an unnamed DepEd official involved in corruption receiving cuts and/or commissions amounting to 40% of the project cost. When asked to identify, he demurred.

As a public servant, the good senator has every right, legally and morally to assail and put to question whatever wrongdoing, any person or instrumentality of the government for that matter in his quest to eradicate graft and corruption in the bureaucracy.

Within a matter of days, however, the whole nation will troop to the polling station to cast their votes for the next President of the Republic.
