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Lack of Respect

What do you do with students who show a lack of respect for adults, peers, their belongingness, and the property of others?

1. The teacher ought to apply the 3 R's: Respect, Responsibility, and Reciprocity.
2. Clearly state the reasons for respecting other people's property. Publicity acknowledges those who demonstrate respect for others' property, so their peers can model their behavior.
3. Don't make a fantastic request, dictate rules without explanations, or give an ultimatum that presents students with a boundary they might be tempted to cross because they feel it is unreasonable.
4. Listen to each student. Never assume that you know what the student is going to say to explain his/her actions.
5. Show that even though, as the teacher, you oversee the class, you respect the student and expect respect in return.
6. Never make idle, sarcastic threats ("How many times have I told you to sit down? I am attending to deduct your recess time for the grading amount unless you behave.")
