But the sad aspect is that certain non-teaching personnel are viewed as the lowest level of employees because of their low pay grade and lack of recognition for their value and extensive administrative duties such as financial and administrative support.

Non-teaching personnel at schools play a crucial role in ensuring that kids learn in a secure and supportive environment. Encourage parent and family involvement in their students' education to develop strong, trustworthy relationships with pupils and improve school climate. Non-teaching personnel can go above and beyond the curriculum by providing trauma-informed practices and positive behavioral interventions resources for parents and teachers. Support workers can model positive behavior and deliver positive messages to kids because they interact with them on a regular basis during the school day.
