It is good to note that way back July 22, 1991, a law protecting the rights and privileges of persons with disabilities was introduced and was finally approved on March 24, 1992. Not only in education and employment the PWDS are given importance but also in health services where in Section 20 of Republic Act 7277 it is clearly stated that the State shall protect and promote the right to health of disabled persons and shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to their health development which shall make essential health services available to them at affordable cost.

For PWDS to be useful members of the society, their civil and political rights are also given the chance to be practiced. With all the features of R.A. 7277, the chance to produce more productive responsible and productive citizens of our country including the PWDs is greater leaving our society lesser problems in terms of employment and decent living for less privileged in terms of health-related condition of people borne with disabilities. R.A. 7277 is the ultimate answer to these PWDs.
