

HOW DOES ONE GO ABOUT BECOMING A SECURITY GUARD IN THE PHILIPPINES?

How do I go about getting a job as a security guard in the Philippines? Security guards are well-known for protecting the environment, property, and people. They monitor buildings and other locations in order to prevent or stop threats and violence. Some people feel that being a security guard in the Philippines or anywhere else in the world is a simple and straightforward vocation, but they are unaware that these security guards must also satisfy specific standards.

Most security guards work in both the public and private sectors. Security guards are essential to display authority to possible threats and to secure not only the place, but also the persons in banks, museums, hospitals, corporate buildings, shopping malls, and other locations and properties.

The following are the list of qualifications to be a Security Officer:

Filipino Citizen

To protect your nation and people, you must be a Filipino citizen. This is really required, especially for private security personnel, and is spelled out in Republic Act No. 548. Any Filipino citizen can work as a security guard as long as they meet the other basic requirements.

Fitness, both physical and mental

Security guards have demanding jobs. They might be told to run, jump, or even lift weights. Physical fitness improves officer and organizational safety. Physically fit and

well-trained security staff can catch suspects fast. Mental fitness is equally important as physical fitness. This is to avoid unjustified rage and aggression, which might escalate to violence in the protected area. Substance abuse is also considered a mental illness, and the majority of those who have experienced it have been admitted to treatment facilities.

This is a prerequisite under the R.A., much as being a Filipino citizen. 5487 specifies that "no one shall be licensed as a private security guard, security officer, security consultants, private detective, or government security employees unless he is physically and psychologically competent."

Completed security training courses

Security education and training come into play here. The purpose of security education and training is to learn about ideas, concepts, and facts in order to develop analytical and problem-solving skills. When it comes to security training, prospective security guards are given a set of skills to apply to a certain role. Potential security guards can attend the following trainings.

Clearances of many kinds

Before becoming a security guard, many sorts of clearances must be filed. This is to ensure that the person has a clean record. R.A. 5487, Rule 5, Section 12 states that new candidates must get a PNP Health Service-approved Neuropsychiatric test clearance. A drug test is performed to check that the individual is clean of any prohibited substances.

Badge of a Security Guard

This is a component of the overall security strategy. The PNP SOSIA badge and affiliation patch are mandated to be worn on all security personnel's uniforms. Failure to wear this may result in an SOSIA Resolution No. 2016-001 violation.

Candidates must have a high school diploma and be at least 18 years old, but no older than fifty, in addition to the qualifications specified above. Your company or agency will supply the remaining needed.

Working as a security guard in the Philippines is not simple. They don't just hang about and watch who comes and departs from a location. When dealing with difficulties or concerns that must be dealt amicably, they must be vigilant, attentive, and present of mind.
