This Office informs all concerned that AIESEC in Ateneo de Manila University will be holding an exclusive youth leadership seminar, the **National Youth Leader's Initiative (NYLI)** on February 27 and March 6, 2021.

During the event, NYLI will be having a project pitch that will reward top three (3) organizations with seed grants ranging from Php 15,000, Php 9,000 and Php 3,000, respectively for the first, second, and third placers in order to support their proposed projects/initiatives.

This activity is open to all public and private junior and senior high school students. A minimum of three (3) and a maximum of ten (10) delegates per organization are invited to join the vent proper and only three (3) delegates from the team will be allowed to pitch the initiative.

There will be a Php 100 delegation fee for those interested participants. Those who are not unable to pay the full delegation fee can check the financial scheme to avail discounts, as well as a scholarship program for a full free admission.



#### Greetings!



#### SCHOLARSHIP PACKAGE:

Interested in joining NYLI but unable to pay the delegate fee? Don't worry! We have a sponsorship program that you can apply for! Your organisation is eligible for free admission if it meets the following criteria. Note that this does NOT mean your organisation will get free admission, but will be reviewed by the NYLI team before granting the scholarship. Kindly note that If your organization is granted the scholarship package, only a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of five (5) delegates will be subsidized.

#### SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA:

- Is not part of a larger entity (ex. Red Cross Philippines under the umbrella of Red Cross International, AIESEC in AdMU being an entity of AIESEC in the Philippines).
- Has no stable source of income in the form of a social enterprise or business belonging to the organisation.
- Has no external donor/funder for the organisation's activities.

NOTE: We are open to groups not necessarily part of an organisation/are not organisations yet have a vision or project they want to execute.



# RATIONALE

The National Youth Leaders' Initiative (NYLI) aims to provide an avenue for youth-run organizations to learn, practice, and develop their skills in youth leadership through keynote sessions from notable speakers, a networking space for delegates to interact with each other, and a project pitch wherein a seed grant will be awarded to the best presenters. At its core, NYLI aims to support young organizations and provide them with a platform to continue making valuable contributions to the country.

# OBJECTIVES

To empower youth organizations by providing them with the resources to execute their projects and plans; to become a platform and avenue for youth organizations to expand their network, learn more about organizational development, and communicate with various stakeholders; to instill the importance of creating meaningful conversations among members of the youth; and to award a seed grant as financial support for the organization's initiatives so that they too can create their own impact

# WHO CAN APPLY?



#### General Profile

NYLI caters to youth-led organizations within the Philippines, composed of members from Senior High School to College.

#### Qualifications

- 1. Applying organizations must have a minimum of five (5) members.
- 2. Applying organizations must have been founded between January 2015 at the earliest and April 2020 at the latest.
- 3. Applying organizations must not be part of a larger branch of organizations (ex. AIESEC, Gawad Kalinga, Red Cross)

#### **Event Proper**

A minimum of three (3) and a maximum of fifteen (15) members per organization can join and participate as delegates.

### Project Pitch Competition

A maximum of three (3) members per organization can participate in the project pitch. These participants should be present during the event proper.

# PROGRAM PROPER DAY I JANUARY 30, 2021

NYLI Day 1 will consist of several keynote sessions from notable speakers that are grounded on four modules with two talks and one activity each. Each module is grounded on AIESEC's Leadership Development Qualities, which will prepare the organizations for their project pitch. Delegates will also be able to attend networking spaces where they can meet and interact with delegates from other organizations.

# PROGRAM PROPER DAY 2 FEBRUARY 6, 2021

NYLI Day 2 will be the day of the project pitch competition. Each organization will be given the opportunity to pitch an innovative and sustainable project that can be feasibly executed with the given seed grant. The purpose of this pitch is to identify a problem or issue that is relevant to society, and to propose feasible solutions to such. There shall be two rounds for the competition—the preliminaries and the finals.

**Preliminaries:** All participating organizations shall present a five-minute initial pitch that introduces their organization, advocacy, and their specific project.

Finals: The top five scoring organizations shall present a final pitch in 8-12 minutes that goes into the specifics of their project. This pitch should also include their proposed sustainable business plan.

## Topic: Sustainable Social Initiative

The project pitch will be graded on the following criteria (AIESEC's Leadership Development Model):


- 1. Self-Awareness: Ability to exhibit the organization's core values and advocacies
- Empowering Others: In-depth understanding of their own working standards; have defined project roles with well-defined job descriptions
- 3. Solution-Oriented: Comprehensive analysis of the chosen issue; proposed innovative and sustainable solutions; concrete and attainable key-performance indicators
- 4. World Citizen: Ability to explain the relevance of the solution to chosen issues given the global and local contexts

### What kind of project can you pitch?

- A. The project must not be a fundraising activity. However, the project can be revenue-generating for the organization.
- B. The winner of the seed grant must not give the cash prize to a beneficiary outright, but rather, they must use the cash prize for project-funding purposes.
- C. The project must be executed within one (1) year and must provide documentation to AIESEC in AdMU.
- D. The project may either be physical or digital, for as long as it abides by community guidelines at the date of its execution.
- E. The project must be aligned with at least one of the four (4) AIESEC LDQs. Participants will be learning about the AIESEC LDQs in specific during the event and can be found in the Participant's Masterfile.







#### B. This initiative aims to:

- a. Empower organizations by providing them with the resources to execute their projects and plans;
- b. Provide a platform and avenue for the organizations to reach a greater network, to learn more about organizational development, and to communicate with various stakeholders; and
- c. Support the organization's initiatives so that they too can create their own impact. The winner of the seed grant will receive a cash prize.
- C. Other rewards and recognition will be given to delegates and organizations who also exemplified excellence during the two-day program.
