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POSITIVE DISCIPLINE NECESSARY IN CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

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A form of discipline known as positive discipline focuses on teaching kids both the right and appropriate ways to behave. It is predicated on the notion that rewards, which can have positive effects, are better for a child's motivation and self-esteem than punishment, which can have unfavorable outcomes.

Giving praise for each student's accomplishment and effort is an example of positive discipline in the classroom While less-than-satisfactory work should be acknowledged but not harshly criticized, exceptional work should be commended and given a high grade. Teachers can also provide students with opportunities for self-correction or raise questions about what happened and how they can improve after they make mistakes.

It is not easy to practice positive discipline, and it is important to remember that there will be obstacles along the way! However, by taking the time to teach students how their actions affect others and demonstrating what they can do instead, we help them learn how to make our world a better place.
