Meanwhile, according to the 2021 World Bank report that Philippines rank in the proficiency levels were below minimum for more than 80 percent of the country's enrollees. Records also says, according to UNESCO Global Education Monitoring Report, Philippines ranked 55th out of 77 in 2021.
