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QUALITY OF A GOOD TEACHER

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Characteristics of a Good Teacher Communication Skills: A teacher is likely to interact with students, coworkers, parents, and administrators on any given day. Therefore, the most important factor in determining whether a teacher is great or mediocre is their ability to communicate effectively. A teacher with strong communication skills is not only adept at speaking and leading a classroom, but also excellent at listening (more on this later). In addition, a teacher with strong communication skills will be able to convey information in a manner that students can comprehend and command their subject matter.

Engaging method of instruction: The fact of the matter is that not all students learn in the same manner. There are many different ways to learn. Visual learning, or seeing representations and/or pictures of information, is better for some students. Others, on the other hand, may prefer to absorb information by listening to audio or a lecture. Teachers who are good are aware that each student has unique requirements. A good teacher will not give up or place blame on a student who is falling behind due to the way they teach. Instead, they can better understand the student's weaknesses by utilizing their communication skills. Then, they might be able to change how they teach to keep the student interested or give them specific activities to help them learn better.

Clarify lesson objectives: Leaders must establish objectives and methods for achieving them, just like businesses do. When it comes to what students are expected to know when they move on to the next level, most schools have established standards. Good teachers make lesson plans and have tools for determining how well their students are doing.



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Skills in discipline: Each teacher can tell a story about a student or group of students who were disruptive. Most of the time, students act out in class for reasons that have nothing to do with what's going on in the classroom. It might be a cry for help or attention for some. For others, it could be a sign that they aren't aware they have a learning disability. Good teachers know how to discipline for whatever reason. Sending a student to a principal or creating grounds for suspension may be necessary at times. However, a teacher may be the ideal person to assist a student in resolving a problem because for some, it may only require a conversation to discover the source of the issue. In addition, being able to control a classroom will help teachers anticipate a student's needs and foster positive relationships with them.

• Patience: Patience is one of the most important qualities for a good teacher to have. Each student learns at their own pace. A teacher is responsible for ensuring that students are supported and feel at ease throughout their educational journey. They can inform students that they can get assistance after class, that they might be willing to extend office hours, or that they can remind students that they can get help if they need it.

Teachers must be able to adapt to the ever-changing world of classroom innovation and adopt new technologies that can improve the workflow for both students and teachers. Passion for education: People enter the education field for a number of different reasons. However, the best educators are made for it. The level of passion that good teachers exhibit is a telltale sign of their quality. Teachers who care deeply are the ones who will stay late after class to provide their students with the necessary support; They are the ones who devote additional time outside of the classroom to developing educational



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concepts for their pupils; They are the ones who provide in-depth feedback rather than merely marking boxes for grades. There are many signs of passion, but these are some that set good teachers apart from average teachers.

Knowledge of the subject: Naturally, it is expected of you as a teacher to be the subject matter expert. You don't have to know everything, but you do need to have a solid and in-depth understanding of the topic. Students will approach you with inquiries; it is definitely preferable if you have the answers! The least you can do for students is to point them in the right direction if you don't know the answer.

"Attentive listeners: Good teachers can better reach their students by listening to their needs (through active listening), which is part of having good communication skills. Listening to their students allows them to learn from them, and good teachers are also lifelong learners. It is not intended for education to be top-down. Because it is interactive,

listening is only half the battle.

• Adaptability: Change is the only thing that stays the same. The classroom, the world, and the speed at which information is shared continue to change. Adaptable teachers are the ones who have the greatest impact on a student's life. In order to connect formal education with life skills, they know how to incorporate events and aspects outside of the classroom and make them accessible to students. Students learn from teachers who can adapt to changing situations how to be resilient and adaptable.



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
