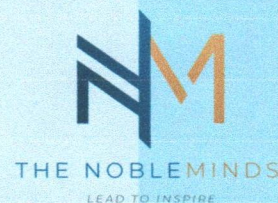
This workshop will help teachers shift to Crucial Textual Production, in order *to teach students to construct text that serve as counter narratives to these dominant texts that they gained the ability to deconstruct* (Morell, 2003). The SHS core subject ORAL COMMUNICATION IN VARIOUS CONTEXT aims to help the students understand the nature and elements of oral communication in context, the functions/purpose of oral communications, and the concept of communicative competence that requires the understanding of speech context, speech style, speech act, and communicative strategy.

This seminar-workshop envisions helping the GRADES 11 AND 12 Senior High School teachers and other basic education teachers and interesting participants enhance their knowledge, competencies, and competencies to teach the course ORAL COMMUNICATION IN VARIOUS CONTEXT more effectively. Participants will have the opportunity to gain a more thorough understanding of the basic concepts, theories, strategies, and principles in teaching and assessing speaking/oral communication for 21st-century learners, and to form insightful and significant perspectives in teaching the course through different learning delivery modalities (i.e., in person or face-to-face, blended, and online). They will also design formative and summative assessment tools for their classroom activities, and apply the knowledge and competencies gained from the training through a team-teaching demonstration with an outcome-based lesson plan and an individual presentation of a speech for a bigger audience.

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
