

EDUCATION AS A DILEMMA IN THE PHILIPPINES

According to the latest released report of World Bank together with Unicef, FCDO, USAid, and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, 90.9 percent of Filipino children aged 10 appear to be in a situation of learning poverty, while 90.4 percent are classified as suffering from learning deprivation. Additionally, 5 percent of Filipino children at that age are still unschooled. There is also a report that 9 out of 10 Filipino children aged 10 are still struggling to read even the simple texts.
