- 1. The Juvenile Justice Welfare Council (JJWC) leads the development of Restorative Justice program design that will produce a technical guide manual integrating Restorative Justice Principles in all existing and future policies and programs on juvenile justice and welfare system.
- 2. In line with this, the Department of Education (DepEd) as one of the members of the External Technical Working Group for the Restorative Justice Pilot Program Design and Technical Guide Manual on Integrating Restorative Justice in the Existing and Future Policies on Juvenile Justice and Welfare System (Formulation, Pilot Testing and Onward Institutionalization) through its Learner Rights and Protection Office (LRPO) tasks to provide technical inputs and evidence-based information in the drafting of the technical guide manual based on the related learner protection guidelines and policies and programs on managing child-at-risk (CAR) and child in Conflict with the Law (CICL) cases.
- 3. Thus, the three (3) Schools Division Offices (SDOs) namely; Division of Bataan, Division of Nueva Ecija and Division of Pampanga shall participate on the study survey.
- 4. Further, the participating divisions from this Region shall randomly select two (2) public elementary schools, two (2) private elementary schools, two (2) public secondary schools (1 JHS and 1 SHS) and two (2) private secondary schools (1 JHS and 1 SHS). In addition, each participating school shall randomly select ten (10) teachers (5 male and 5 female) who shall participate in the baseline study survey of the development of the restorative justice program design in schools.
