Make certain that the kids are familiar with the guidelines. Spend some time discussing the rules in your classroom on the first day of class. Describe the meaning of each rule. Give instances of when and how the rule is abided by.

Describe the effects. Inform students of the repercussions of disobeying the rules. These could take place in phases, such as a warning, followed by staying after school, a meeting with the principal, and so on.

Have the pupils make a commitment to the rules. Ask the children to come to an agreement with you about the rules. They can just raise their hands. In doing so, they will promise to uphold the class rules.

These are only some ways to maintain discipline. Teachers should bear in mind that if positive discipline prevails in the classroom, then more time for learning will take place.
