In this sense, additional scores that will be given by the teacher is one form of extrinsic motivation.

As per the theory of B.F. Skinner is known for "Operant Conditioning Theory". This theory refers to behavioral learning. To vividly explain it think that the motivation of a student is her eagerness to learn while the reinforcements given by the teacher were his motivator. Look at the context of classroom recitations. If the student answers a question and the teacher praises him whether it is excellent or good, this shows the operant conditioning theory. In this lieu, each time the student responded correctly to the classroom recitations, it is called the operant while if the teacher praises the student whether good or excellent, it is called the reinforcement. In parallel to the idea mentioned previously, as the student is eager to answer questions from the teacher, it does mean that she is motivated to do it, while the motivator in the given situation is the teacher because she gives positive feedback to the student to boost the student's confidence to answer.
