According to researchers, a core strategy for effective teaching, four components of classroom management were identified and analyzed, including rules and regulations, disciplinary interventions, teacher-student interactions, and mental sets are what we called classroom management.





Another explanation based on Sousa is that strong, harmonious, and supportive relationships between teachers and students are fundamental to student success at school. And the impact of a positive classroom management climate feels safe, respectful, welcoming, and supportive of student learning.
