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TVL MARITIME: ROAD TO THE SEA

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Millions of Filipinos are working overseas as seafarers, and the educational sector saw this opportunity to offer a Technical-Vocational-Livelihood (TVL) program called Maritime Specialization, wherein students enrolled in this strand will be able to acquire necessary learning and training in order to qualify as ratings at sea (Midway Colleges, 2022). Strategic planning, navigational, organizational, and foreign language skills are also relevant in the strand. Those traits are mandatory for an individual to succeed in the maritime industry (Pell, 2020).

While the advantages are evident, some disadvantages coexist with them. Many of the maritime schools in the country are not fully equipped to cater to the simulation



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requirements of the learners. This problem even caused the country's industry to be banned in terms of providing seafarers to European-flagged vessels a few years ago. This only means institutions must invest in developing facilities to let their students experience holistic learning (Silverio, 2023). Once addressed, Filipino students interested in overseas will have better employment opportunities after their senior high school years.

As the maritime industry opens itself to greater demands from all over the world, one thing is sure: more job opportunities for TVL Maritime graduates. Port logistics operators and managers will have higher demands than in previous years, and many shore-based positions will resurface, providing more careers to people aspiring to work in the fast-paced industry of port operations and navigations.
