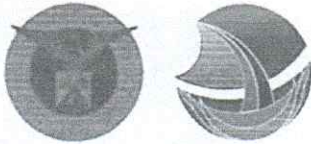

Theme: “The Future of Public Service in the Fourth Industrial Revolution: Trends, Challenges, and Prospects.”

With the disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, there was an unprecedented shift towards the rapid adoption and use of digital technologies in many sectors, including education and public service. For instance, academic institutions were forced to adopt innovative learning strategies, including digital and non-digital teaching modalities, to ensure the seamless delivery of quality education during the pandemic. Meanwhile, the alarming rise in mental health issues among the youth has compelled several groups to offer online counseling services due to the prolonged periods of quarantine, isolation, and uncertainty. The use of digital technologies in public service was seen as crucial and goes beyond the circumstances during the pandemic. As we aspire towards the full integration of technological innovations in public service delivery, the government, industry, and the academe should synergistically resolve the increasing number of challenges that come with it and ensure inclusive, human-centered, and pro-people development prospects.

The fifth installment of the Colleges and Universities Public Service Conference shall highlight the public service initiatives research and best practices on the adoption and use of technological innovations, before, during, and after the pandemic, of public and private Higher Education Institutions from local and international universities and colleges, Government Offices (GO’s), Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Companies and private sectors with corporate social responsibility; and Local Government Units.
