#### **About the Project**

#### I. Background of the Project

- 1. The global internet and the information and communication technologies (ICTs) that connect people to the online world today are essential tools for the global community to collectively work towards achieving sustainable development. ICT has transformed the way in which individuals conduct business, purchase goods and services, send and receive money, communicate, share information, interact with people, and form and cultivate relationships with others. This transformation, as well as the world's everincreasing use of and dependency on ICT, creates vulnerabilities to criminals and other malicious actors targeting ICT and/or using ICT to commit crime.
- 2. Cybercrime is an ongoing and escalating challenge for both the public and private sectors around the globe. It's no longer effective to view cybercrime solely through the lens of a specific criminal or type of crime. Rather, cybercrime is now a large and diverse enterprise, often available for sale, to commit a variety of attacks, such as fraud, theft, and espionage. It could be financially motivated, or nation state supported, or both.



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- Cybercriminals are developing and boosting their attacks at an alarming pace. According
  to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, cybercrime skyrocketed at an alarming rate of
  300% since the coronavirus pandemic started from phishing attacks to phony domains
  to intruders on videoconferences.
- 4. In view of the emerging threats, the Cybercrime Investigation and Coordinating Center (CICC) is launching the Anti-Cybercrime Campaign and Upskilling Initiative for Community, otherwise known as Project ACUITY across the Philippines.

#### II. Legal Basis and Policy Directives

- Consistent with the PDP 2017-2022 in ensuring security, public order, and safety, the CICC aims to:
  - a. establish a secure and resilient cyberspace.
  - b. strengthen the partnership between law enforcement agencies, local peace and order institutions, and communities.
  - c. sustain and expand systems for responding and emergencies.
  - d. prevent and counter terrorism and the rise of radicalization leading to violent extremism; and
  - e. enhance the capability of the law enforcement offices and agencies to address security threats.
- 2. Consistent with Sustainable Development Goal, this initiative targets to contribute to the targets sets forth in the SDG, as follows:
  - End abuse, exploitation, trafficking and all forms of violence against and torture of children; a
  - Ensure public access to information and protect fundamental freedoms, in accordance with national legislation and international agreements
- 3. Pursuant to the provisions of the Republic Act No. 10175, otherwise known as the "Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012", the CICC is mandated to facilitate training and capacity building related to cybercrime prevention, suppression and prosecution. The CICC is also mandated to coordinate the support and participation of the business sector, local government units and non-government organizations in cybercrime prevention programs and other related projects.

- 4. To support the efforts in proliferating information against gender-based online sexual harassment and consistent with the provisions of the Republic Act No. 11313, otherwise known as the "Safe Spaces Act", and the Republic Act No. 11930, otherwise known as the Anti-Online Sexual Abuse or Exploitation of Children (Anti-OSAEC) and Anti-Child Sexual Abuse or Exploitation Materials (CSAEM) Act, the CICC aims to bolster the information campaign about these new laws.
- 5. In accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding/Agreement between the Department of Information and Communications Technology and the Cybercrime Investigation and Coordinating Center and consistent with their complementing mandates as provided by the law, such as to establish ICT infrastructure for public access (for DICT) and to facilitate capacity building initiatives to prevent and suppress cybercrimes (for CICC).

#### III. Brief Description

- 1. Understand the Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012 and the role of the CICC in the prevention, suppression and prosecution of cybercrimes.
- Comprehend other laws relevant to ensuring cyber security and cyber safety such as RA No. 11313 and RA No. 11930.
- Identify most common forms of cybercrimes in GIDAS and what measures are taken by local government units (LGUs) in prevention and suppression.
- Develop residents' resilience to cybercrime providing them basic knowledge on cyber security.
- Be confident and willing to report to barangay officials and/or LGUs any irregularity or signs of OSAEC in the community and other forms of cyber threats.
- Promote CICC news and platforms as primary sources of relevant and truthful information related to cyber safety.


