Moreover, fostering open communication channels among key individuals about the pupils as well as regular feedback mechanisms can facilitate early intervention. It even provides holistic support to pupils who are facing behavioral challenges.

Pupils' behavior is a dynamic aspect (Porter, 2020). It does not only cover his/ her actions inside the classroom but also all aspects of his life. It covers his experiences inside their home, and to the environment he/ she is existing. Nevertheless, it has to be understood as a complex educational landscape that requires careful attention and

proactive management among teachers, school administration, and even parents. Understanding the different underlying factors that influence his/ her behavior is necessary. Likewise, implementing effective strategies, and fostering a supportive learning environment can create a positive and conducive learning atmosphere. Thus, it does not only affect or influence the pupils with behavior problems but the entire class who are striving hard to achieve academic success.

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
