**ADMINISTRATION OF THE NATIONAL LEARNING CAMP
ASSESSMENT (NLCA) POST-TEST FOR GRADES 8-11**

1. In reference to DepEd Memorandum No. 040, s. 2024 titled Administration of the National Learning Camp Assessment (NLCA) 2024 and DepEd Memorandum BEA-2024-07-933 titled Administration of the NLCA Post-Test 2024, this Office informs all concerned on the conduct of NLCA Post-test for Grades 8 to 11 public school learners.
2. This activity aims to determine the effectiveness of the learning camp intervention on the learning proficiencies of participating learners before and after attending the National Learning Camp.
3. In connection to this, the NLCA Post-test will be administered to all **Grade 8 to 11 learners** for School Year 2024-2025 who took the **Pre-Test for NLCA** and **participated in the NLCA** in all public schools across country.
4. The assessment will be computer-based and shall cover learning areas in English, Science, and Mathematics. Each test item will measure varying levels of skills and competencies in a multiple-choice format using the English language.
5. The NLCA shall be administered on the following schedule:

6. Further, each school will be composed of the following key testing personnel: School ICT Coordinator, School Testing Coordinator and School Testing Administrator (See Enclosure No. 1).



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7. Consequently, the Division Testing Personnel, Ms. Hermie G. Duran as the Division Testing Coordinator, Ms. Francez Paulene C. Tabije as the Alternate Division Testing Coordinator, and Mr. Richard S. Alboro as the Division IT Officer will be monitoring the schools' preparation and test proper on the said dates to ensure proper implementation of NLCA Assessment and to give technical assistance.
