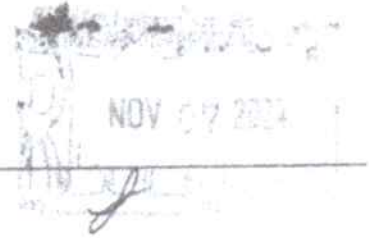

**STAKEHOLDERS' CONVERGENCE ON LEARNER RIGHTS AND PROTECTION
(LRP) POLICIES**

To : Schools Division Superintendents
Chiefs, School Governance Operations Division (SGOD)
Division Partnership Focal Persons
Officers- Parent Teacher Association (PTA)
Education Stakeholders
All Others Concerned

1. Anent to 1987 Philippine Constitution, the State shall defend the right of children to assistance, including proper care and nutrition, and special protection from all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation and other conditions prejudicial to their development (Article XV, Section 3(2)).
2. Pursuant to its mandate, the Department of Education (DepEd) shall ensure to protect learners from all forms of physical and mental violence, injury and abuse, neglect or negligent treatment, maltreatment and exploitation including sexual abuse and its all forms. Thus, DepEd plays a crucial role in learner protection within schools, focusing on creating safe and supportive environments for all learners.
3. In line with this, the Department of Education (DepEd) Regional Office III through Education Support Services Division (ESSD) shall conduct the Stakeholders' Convergence on Learner Rights and Protection (LRP) Policies with the theme "Strengthening Connections toward Child-Friendly Schools" on December 06, 2024 in Our Lady of Fatima University-Pampanga Gymnasium, City of San Fernando, Pampanga.
4. The activity aims the following.
 - 4.1 Provide comprehensive platform for all stakeholders to ensure they understand their roles and responsibilities in learner rights and protection;
 - 4.2 Ensure all stakeholders are familiar with the learner rights and protection policy of the Department and its implications;
 - 4.3 Establish clear lines of communication among all parties to foster collaboration and quick response to concerns; and
 - 4.4 Outlines preventive strategies, reducing the risk of incidents and creating a proactive approach to learner safety and free from all forms of abuses.



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5. Further, the expected attendees are the following.
 - 5.1 Division Partnership Focal Persons
 - 5.2 Division Learner Rights and Protection Coordinators
 - 5.3 Parent Teacher Association Officers/Members current SY, 15 pax per SDO
 - 5.4 Invited Organization partners, 15 pax per organizational partner

Guidelines and Mechanics

1. Participants are bona-fide officers/members of the organizational partners and Parent Teachers Association officers across the region.
 - 1.1 Each SDO/organizational partner shall submit one (1) entry.
 - 1.2 Each group/entry shall not exceed 15 members and minimum of 10 members of PTA/ organizational partners Officers/Members.



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2. The performance must be an original work of the participants and all rights including copy rights of the entry must be exclusively owned by the participants.
3. The lyrics must be in Filipino or English or a combination of both. Vulgar words are not allowed.
4. Performance shall not exceed five (5.0) minutes, including intro and extro.
5. The Board of Judges shall be in complete control of the competition; their decision shall be final and irrevocable.

Criteria

Relevance to the theme <i>The all aspects of the performance significantly relate to the theme</i>	5%
Clarity of Lyrics, Music and Tune Lyrics are syntactically and grammatically correct, while allowing for colloquial expressions and artistic language use. Performer(s) makes the song their own and present a strong stylistic interpretation, incorporating dynamics & expressive musical feeling. Good articulation, rhythm accuracy, audibility, and voice projection.	25%
Originality and Creativity The performance is unique, unconventional and engage the audience in the (story) performance in a creative manner.	25%
Choreography and Timing The performance executed surprising, authenticity of choreography, synchronization, stage presence, engage audience with showmanship and protection.	25%
Props and Costume The materials/ equipment used and attire of the performers must be appropriate to the theme of the routine/performance.	20%
