Greetings!



In light of the upcoming 5th Bataan Council Kab-O-Ree scheduled for November 15-17, 2024, at Brgy. Alion, Mariveles, Bataan, we bring to your attention the current inclement weather forecasts, a thunderstorm advisory, and the expected entry of Tropical Storm Pepito into the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

As head of the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO), we have to prioritize the safety of all participants. Pepito, internationally known as Man-Yi, is forecasted to intensify into a typhoon or potentially a super typhoon, with projected landfall on the eastern coast of Luzon over the weekend. This adds to the risk of heavy rains, strong winds, and severe thunderstorms during the Kab-O-Ree event period.

Given these circumstances, we strongly recommend the cancellation or postponement of the event to avoid any potential emergencies. The threat posed by the combination of thunderstorms and an approaching tropical storm makes it unsafe for outdoor gatherings, especially in exposed areas.

We understand the importance of the event and its impact on participants, but the safety and well-being of all attendees must remain the highest priority. Our office stands ready to provide further assistance or coordination for rescheduling if necessary.
