- 1. This Office announces the conduct the Division Search for the 2025 Gawad Paggabay: Pag-pupugay sa Gurong Taga-hubog, Punong-Guro, at Bayaning Magaaral.
- 2. The Gawad Pag-gabay aims the following:
  - a) Recognize and appreciate the outstanding performance, accomplishments, and significant contributions of school heads, teacher-advisers, student leaders, and learner formators in implementing relevant and responsive learner formation programs contributing to the delivery of accessible and quality basic education for all and learners' holistic development;
  - b) Encourage and motivate learner program implementers to plan and implement significant learner formation programs, projects, and activities responsive to addressing the pressing issues concerning today's learner; and,
  - c) Sustain and promote high-impact learner formation programs, projects, and activities that lead learners to become agents of change and responsible citizens.
- 3. The Learner Formation Activities Programs, Projects, and implemented/accomplished from August 2023 - January 2025 shall only be considered for the 2025 Gawad Pag-Gabay Search.
- 4. The first-place winners will represent SDO Bataan at the Regional Level.





















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- The winners of the Most Outstanding Student Leaders award from each school, their respective Teacher Advisers, and School Heads will receive the same award.
- 6. The deadline for submitting entries is February 7, 2024, at SDO Bataan, Kabukiran, Calaylayan, Abucay, Bataan.
- 7. The awarding ceremony is scheduled on February 21, 2025, with the venue to be announced.
- The Search is open to all public elementary and secondary schools, school heads, teacher-advisers, student leaders, and division federated Learner Government Programs that are excellently implementing the Learner Formation Flagship Programs.
- All expenses incurred by the participants and the search committee in conducting this search shall be charged against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.


