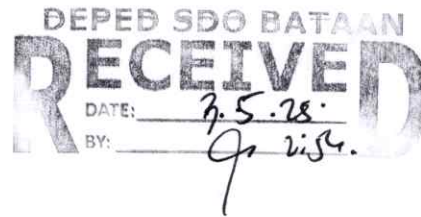

The **2nd Council Gathering of Girl Leaders: YUNGA Challenge** will be held on **March 28-30, 2025** at **Bagumbayan Elementary School, Pilar, Bataan**. All the GSP School Level Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, and Secretary of Secondary and Senior High Schools are encouraged to participate in the yearly girl leader's training.



The theme of this girl-led gathering is **"Eco-Quest: Girls for a Sustainable Change"**. It highlights the crucial role of women in establishing and fostering sustainable solutions. YUNGA Challenge Badges aim to raise awareness, educate and motivate young girls to become an active agent of change in a local community. I. QUALIFICATION OF PARTICIPANTS

1. Registered and active Senior or Cadet Girl Scout;
2. Must be the GSP School Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, or Secretary;
(Maximum of 3 participants per school);
3. Physically fit;
4. Willing to share with and learn from each other; and
5. Duly endorsed by their Troop Leader at their respective schools.

The event is open for Senior and Cadet Girl Scouts coming from all secondary schools in SDO-Balanga and SDO-Bataan. Schools may send **a maximum number of 3 participants** per school. Only those who have duly accomplished the event registration form and payment before on the exact deadline given shall be considered as official delegates.

Participants must arrive by 10:00 A.M on March 28 and should finish the event by March 30 in the afternoon. They are expected to leave Bagumbayan Elementary School in the afternoon of March 30.

II. EVENT FEE

The event fee is **One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (1,500)** per participant to cover food, accommodation, program materials, souvenirs, badges, and activities.

III. FOOD

Meals at the event will be from dinner on March 28 (Friday) until PM snacks on March 30 (Sunday). Please inform us in advance should there be food prohibitions.

IV. ACCOMMODATION

All the participants will be billeted at Bagumbayan ES during the event. Every participant must bring their own beddings and tent.
