#### PROVISION OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND MONITORING OF SPECIAL CURRICULAR PROGRAMS (SCP)

- 1. In line with the Schools Division Office of Bataan's commitment to ensuring quality implementation of Special Curricular Programs (SCPs), this Office shall conduct a Division-wide provision of technical assistance and monitoring of SCP-implementing schools from April 24 - May 8, 2025.
- 2. This initiative aims to evaluate the effectiveness of the following special programs:
  - a) Special Science in Elementary Schools (SSES),
  - b) Science, Technology, and Engineering(STE),
  - c) Special Program in Arts (SPA),
  - d) Special Program in Sports (SPS),
  - e) Special Program in Journalism (SPJ),
  - f) Special Program in Foreign Language (SPFL),
  - g) Special Program in Technology and Livelihood Education (SPTLE),
  - h) Madrasah Education Program,
  - i) Alternative Learning System (ALS), and
  - Indigenous Peoples Education (IPED). j)
  - k) Special Needs Education (SNED)
- 3. The monitoring and technical assistance will focus on classroom instruction, curriculum implementation, learner engagement, and compliance with DepEd standards and policies. The monitoring team, composed of Education Program Supervisors (EPS) from different learning areas, shall also provide on-site coaching and guidance to SCP implementers.

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



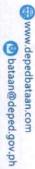
