# MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR

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- 1. Reference is made to the attached National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) Memorandum Circular No. 3, dated 11 April 2025, with the Subject: "Guidelines for the Gawad KALASAG Seal and Special Awards for Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management and Humanitarian Assistance.
- 2. The Gawad KALASAG (KAlamidad at Sakuna LAbanan, SAriling Galing ang Kaligtasan) Search for Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management and Humanitarian Assistance has served as the country's recognition and award scheme for various stakeholders who promote and implement disaster risk reduction and management, climate change adaptation (DRRM-CCA), and humanitarian assistance programs that protect and shield high-risk communities against extreme hazards and render them more capable of addressing their vulnerabilities.
- 3. The 25th Gawad KALASAG (GK) Seal and Special Awards for Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management and Humanitarian Assistance CY 2025 shall commence its search beginning 01 May 2025.
- 4. For this year's search, the GK will cover the (a) GK Seal for Local DRRM Council/Offices (LDRRMCO); (b) GK Special Awards for CSOs (i.e., Best Civil Society Organization, Best People's Organization, Best Volunteer Organization), Best Private Organizations; Best Local Government Emergency Management and Response Teams (GEMs); GK Special Awards for Hospitals; Schools; and Private Organization and (c) Special Recognition for Individuals, Group, and Organizations.
- 5. In this regard, all Local DRRM Councils and Offices (LDRRMCOs) are directed to commence self-assessment using the GK Seal for LDRRMCO Assessment Tool, which may be accessed through https://tinyurl.com/GKCentralLuzon2025. The completed assessment tool and means of verification (MOVs) in prescribed format and the notarized Omnibus Sworn Statement (OSS) must be submitted by 20 June 2025 (through flash drive/memory stick).
- 6. Meanwhile, entries for GK Special Awards for (i) CSOs (i.e., Local Civil Society Organization, People's Organization, Volunteer Organization); (ii) Government Emergency Management and Response Teams (GEMs); (iii) Hospitals (i.e. National, Local, and Private); (Iv) Schools (i.e. Higher Education Institutions, Public Elementary, Public High Schools); (v) Private Organizations (i.e. Business/Corporate); and Special Recognitions (i.e. for Heroic Acts for both living and posthumous individuals, group, and other special recognitions for individuals and organizations) will be accepted until 26 May 2025.
