Littlewood (2023) highlighted that in today's diverse classrooms, CLT has gained renewed importance as it aligns with global educational goals that emphasize collaboration, critical thinking, and learner autonomy.

A key feature of CLT is its focus on meaningful and purposeful communication. Activities such as information gap tasks, role plays, debates, and collaborative problem-solving simulate real-life situations, motivating students to actively use the target language. This learner-centered approach fosters authentic interaction, allowing students to practice fluency, negotiate meaning, and build confidence in expressing themselves. During my training on the Revised K to 12 Curriculum, I learned that CLT values fluency and communicative effectiveness. This approach leads to a more comprehensive understanding of the language, rather than focusing solely on accuracy. As learners engage in interactive tasks, they also develop a deeper awareness of cultural context and appropriate language use – essential components of effective global communication.

Furthermore, CLT promotes the integration of all four language skills such as listening, speaking, reading, and writing, within communicative contexts. In this

approach, teachers serve as facilitators who guide learners through engaging, student-led activities, fostering collaboration and critical thinking. The adaptability of CLT makes it suitable for diverse learners and various educational settings, including online and hybrid environments. Recent advancements in educational technology have further enhanced CLT's effectiveness, with digital tools like video conferencing, interactive apps, and online discussion boards providing new opportunities for real-time communication and feedback (Nguyen & Habók, 2020). These innovations support continuous and contextualized learning, preparing students for both academic and real-world communication challenges.

Communicative Language Teaching offers a strong and flexible framework for developing practical language skills in today's learners. Its emphasis on meaningful interaction, student engagement, and contextualized instruction makes it a powerful tool in language education.
