1. Pursuant to Regional Memorandum No. 221, s. 2025 titled "Implementing Guidelines of Project INSIGHT (Innovative System for Gauging Holistic Teaching and Learning): A Strategic Online Assessment Initiative for Grades 3 and 11 Learners in Region III for School Year 2025–2026," all concerned are hereby informed of the implementation of Project INSIGHT in the division. 3. This initiative is closely aligned with the Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning (ARAL) Program, complementing it through diagnostic assessment that helps identify which learners need support, in what specific areas, and to what extent.

### IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES OF PROJECT INSIGHT (INNOVATIVE SYSTEM FOR GAUGING HOLISTIC TEACHING AND LEARNING): A STRATEGIC ONLINE ASSESSMENT INITIATIVE FOR GRADES 3 AND 11 LEARNERS IN REGION III FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2025-2026

To : Schools Division Superintendents Public Schools District Supervisors Public Elementary and Secondary School Heads All Others Concerned

1. In its continuous pursuit of improving the quality of basic education through data-driven and technology-enabled innovations, the Department of Education (DepEd) Region III introduces **Project INSIGHT (Innovative System for Gauging Holistic Teaching and Learning)**, a strategic initiative aimed at implementing an online assessment system for Grades 3 and 11 learners across the region. Anchored in DepEd's 5-Point Reform Agenda and DepEd Region III's FUTUR3S of Education, this project underscores the crucial role of timely, accurate, and relevant learner assessment in driving evidence-based improvements in curriculum implementation, instructional planning, and learner support systems.

- 2. The implementation of Project INSIGHT aims to:
  - a. Establish a comprehensive online assessment platform that effectively evaluates literacy and numeracy skills in Grade 3 and essential academic competencies in Grade 11;
  - b. Generate real-time, comprehensive data on learner performance to inform curriculum refinement, instructional alignment, and resource allocation;
  - c. Provide targeted technical assistance to school leaders and teachers in interpreting results and applying data to classroom instruction;
  - d. Facilitate early identification of learning gaps, particularly for struggling learners, and provide support through data-driven interventions; and
  - e. Cultivate a sustainable, data-driven culture of continuous quality improvement across schools in Region III.

3. Project INSIGHT also complements the Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning (ARAL) Program, a national initiative that provides targeted remediation to assist struggling learners in Reading, Mathematics, and Science. While ARAL focuses on intervention, Project INSIGHT enhances this by serving as a strategic diagnostic tool that offers timely, objective, and data-driven insights, identifying which learners







need support, in which areas, and to what extent. The project is especially focused on Grade 3 learners, who need early detection and intervention to prevent long-term academic problems, and Grade 11 learners, who must be properly prepared for their future pathways. By addressing the lack of a region-wide online assessment system, Project INSIGHT establishes a strong foundation for delivering precise, equitable, and effective learning interventions across the region.

4. Supported by the i-Ready Assessment and Learning System, Project INSIGHT enables schools to administer online, adaptive, and domain-specific assessments in Literacy and Numeracy for Grade 3 and in key academic subjects for Grade 11. The platform features automated scoring, real-time dashboards, and diagnostic tools that provide authentic and actionable insights into learners' strengths and learning gaps. These insights equip teachers, school leaders, and education officials to make informed, learner-centered instructional decisions that support academic recovery and progression.

### IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES OF PROJECT INSIGHT (INNOVATIVE SYSTEM FOR GAUGING HOLISTIC TEACHING AND LEARNING): A STRATEGIC ONLINE ASSESSMENT INITIATIVE FOR GRADES 3 AND 11 LEARNERS IN REGION III FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2025-2026

### I. RATIONALE

In its continuous commitment to enhancing the quality of basic education, the Department of Education (DepEd) Region III underscores the need for innovative, data-driven strategies to ensure that every learner receives appropriate support and opportunities to succeed. Recognizing the vital role of technology in modernizing education systems, the region introduces Project INSIGHT (Innovative System for Gauging Holistic Teaching and Learning), a strategic initiative designed to institutionalize an online assessment system for Grade 3 and Grade 11 learners across all cities and municipalities in the region, generating diagnostic results in literacy and numeracy that inform targeted instruction, learning interventions, and systemic improvements.

Anchored on DepEd's 5-Point Agenda, DepEd Order No. 18, s. 2025 (Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning or ARAL Program), and fully aligned with DepEd Region III's FUTUR3S for Education framework, Project INSIGHT aims to strengthen the foundation of curriculum implementation by providing timely, accurate, and comprehensive data on learner performance. Through the use of I-Ready, this project enables schools to systematically identify learning gaps, monitor academic growth, and design targeted interventions to meet the diverse needs of learners.

Moreover, the project aims to empower teachers, school leaders, and education stakeholders by providing them with actionable insights derived from Project INSIGHT diagnostic results. These results guide instructional planning, inform resource allocation, and support evidence-based policy development at all levels of the education system. By establishing an online assessment system modeled after those used by international large-scale assessments, Project INSIGHT promotes a culture of evidence-based decision-making and continuous improvement, ultimately leading to higher learning outcomes, increased teacher effectiveness, and improved overall school governance.

In support of more context-specific and equitable education reforms, Project INSIGHT strategically organizes assessment and reporting at the city and municipal level. This approach ensures that learner data reflects the unique educational, cultural, and socioeconomic conditions of each locality. By focusing on results per city or municipality, the project allows for the development of highly localized and targeted interventions. More importantly, this design enhances coordination with







Local Government Units (LGUs), which play a crucial role in supporting school programs and sustaining educational initiatives. With LGUs as active partners, DepEd Region III can mobilize local resources, policies, and networks to scale meaningful and responsive reforms based on objective diagnostic evidence.

Recent global and local education studies and policy recommendations strongly support this initiative. According to UNICEF (2022), leveraging technology and data systems is crucial in addressing learning poverty and ensuring equitable education recovery, particularly in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic disruptions. Furthermore, the OECD Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) 2018 results highlighted the importance of data-informed instruction and school governance in improving student performance, noting that systems that use strong assessment data tend to achieve better learning outcomes.

Additionally, the World Bank's 2021 Philippines Public Expenditure and Institutional Review highlights that investing in learning assessments and digital tools is crucial for supporting fundamental skills and closing learning gaps among Filipino students. The findings from the Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM II) also emphasize the urgent need for systemic reforms that include comprehensive learner assessments to guide policy and instructional decisions at all levels.

Through Project INSIGHT, DepEd Region III reaffirms its commitment to transforming basic education by utilizing diagnostic results that offer an in-depth, objective understanding of learners' strengths and learning gaps in literacy and numeracy. These results serve as a powerful basis for evidence-informed planning and decision-making at the school, division, and regional levels. By capturing localized learner performance, Project INSIGHT enables the development of targeted interventions and policies that are responsive to the unique educational contexts of each city and municipality. This data-driven approach strengthens the region's capacity to deliver inclusive, equitable, and quality education, aligned with the aspirations of Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4).

### **II. SCOPE**

The Implementation Guidelines for Project INSIGHT provide detailed guidance on managing online assessments with I-Ready across all cities and municipalities in Region III, with a focus on learners in Grades 3 and 11. This helps identify learning gaps, monitor academic progress, and support data-driven teaching strategies. It also explains the responsibilities of schools, SDOs, and regional offices in ensuring the smooth implementation, effective use of diagnostic results, and alignment with national recovery programs, such as ARAL.







### **III. DEFINITION OF TERMS**

For purposes of these Guidelines, the following terms are defined and understood as follows:

**Assessment Results Presentation** – Post-assessment activity where school leaders, teachers, and stakeholders analyze diagnostic data and formulate actionable steps for improvement.

**Assessment Windows** – Designated periods during the school year when online diagnostic assessments are administered to target learner groups (Grades 3 and 11) to track progress and guide interventions.

**Diagnostic Results** – The data outputs generated from learners' i-Ready assessments serve as the foundation for curriculum planning, targeted interventions, and instructional decision-making.

**i-Ready**<sup>TM</sup> – An adaptive, web-based assessment platform that provides diagnostic data in literacy and numeracy, offering personalized insights and instructional tools.

**Learning Recovery** – A set of strategies and programs designed to close learning gaps and accelerate progress for learners affected by academic disruption.

**Literacy Skills** – The learner's ability to read with understanding, interpret text, and communicate effectively using written language, measured through domain-specific tools in Project INSIGHT.

**Numeracy Skills** – The learner's ability to understand and apply mathematical concepts in problem-solving and real-life contexts, measured through domain-specific tools in Project INSIGHT.

**Project INSIGHT** – The "Innovative System for Gauging Holistic Teaching and Learning," a regional initiative institutionalizing online assessment in Grades 3 and 11 to inform instruction and drive learning recovery.

**Struggling Learners** – Learners who perform below the expected proficiency level in key learning areas and are identified through diagnostic tools such as i-Ready<sup>TM</sup>.

**Targeted Intervention** – Instructional strategies and learning support activities are designed based on assessment data to address the specific needs of individual learners.







### **IV. POLICY STATEMENT**

Rooted in the Department of Education's commitment to providing quality, inclusive, and learner-centered education, this Office recognizes the essential role of data-driven and technology-enabled strategies in supporting continuous improvement and evidence-based decision-making. In line with this commitment, this Office hereby establishes the Implementing Guidelines for Project INSIGHT (Innovative System for Gauging Holistic Teaching and Learning) to offer clear guidance on managing online assessments for Grade 3 and Grade 11 learners across all schools in Region III. These guidelines provide a framework for the systematic collection, analysis, and utilization of learner performance data to inform instructional planning, enhance curriculum implementation, and enhance overall school governance.

### **V. IMPLEMENTATION GUIDELINES**

### A. Sampling Framework and Local-Level Strategy

This project adopts the Pareto Principle, wherein 20% of the learner population across the 130 cities and municipalities in Region III is strategically selected to yield an 80% overall picture of learner performance in Grades 3 and 11. In consideration of the significant costs involved in outsourcing an external assessment provider, schools are carefully chosen based on the number of learners that this 20% sample can generate, using quota sampling techniques (see Enclosure No. 2).

This localized sampling strategy is intentionally designed to reflect the unique educational contexts and specific needs of learners at the community level. Unlike Schools Division Offices, which cover broader and often highly diverse populations, cities and municipalities provide a more focused and homogeneous unit of analysis. Sampling at this level supports:

- a. Localized representation, allowing the project to capture educational variations and challenges that are more specific and consistent within each city and municipality;
- b. Equity in data, ensuring that every community, regardless of division size or population, is proportionally and fairly represented;
- c. Operational feasibility, enabling a more manageable structure for monitoring, data analysis, and intervention planning, particularly for Regional Education Program Supervisors assigned to specific areas;







d. Responsive program design, empowering the Region to develop targeted strategies and interventions that align with each locality's unique socioeconomic, cultural, and geographic realities.

Moreover, the decision to focus on cities and municipalities as the primary sampling units is anchored on the strategic intent to strengthen engagement with Local Government Units (LGUs). Cities and municipalities serve as the core administrative units through which LGUs operate, making them essential partners in ensuring the program's long-term sustainability. By aligning the project at the LGU level, DepEd Region III can effectively leverage local policies, resources, and community-based support systems to institutionalize assessment-driven educational reforms and foster local ownership of learning improvement initiatives.

This approach not only enhances cross-sector collaboration but also encourages LGUs to actively share responsibility in improving learning outcomes within their communities. Ultimately, this design ensures that the region's diverse learning environments are accurately represented in the analysis and that the resulting interventions are relevant, targeted, and impactful, supported by stronger local partnerships for sustainable educational development.

### B. I-Ready<sup>TM</sup> as an External Assessment Provider

For the implementation of Project INSIGHT, the Department of Education (DepEd) Region III has engaged I-Ready, developed by Curriculum Associates, as the external assessment provider for learners in Grades 3 and 11. I-Ready is a researchbased, adaptive online assessment platform widely recognized for its ability to provide valid, reliable, and actionable data on learner performance. It combines diagnostic assessments and personalized instructional tools, designed to comprehensively measure learners' strengths, areas for improvement, and overall academic progress in core domains such as reading and mathematics.

The adaptive nature of I-Ready means that each test responds dynamically to the learner's responses in real-time, offering a more accurate and personalized understanding of each student's skill level. This makes it an excellent tool for systematically identifying learning gaps, guiding instructional decisions, and supporting differentiated instruction.

For Grade 3, I-Ready assessments focus on foundational skills essential for progressing to upper elementary levels, including early literacy, reading comprehension, and basic mathematical concepts. This supports DepEd's goal of strengthening early grade mastery to reduce learning poverty. For Grade 11, the platform evaluates advanced literacy and math skills necessary for senior high school readiness, college preparation, and entering the workforce. This aligns with the







region's efforts to ensure students graduate with the skills needed for further studies and lifelong learning.

Additionally, I-Ready provides detailed reporting dashboards that enable teachers, school leaders, and education officials to review learner data at multiple levels: individual, class, school, and system-wide. These reports support evidencebased instructional planning, the development of targeted interventions, and the strategic allocation of resources.

By partnering with I-Ready as the external assessment provider, Project INSIGHT strengthens its commitment to using internationally recognized, highquality tools to foster educational improvement. This strategy aligns with DepEd Region III's main goal of providing inclusive, equitable, and quality education, in line with national and global standards.

### C. I-Ready<sup>™</sup> PROGRAM REQUIREMENT

The i-Ready Diagnostic Assessment is an online assessment tool designed to support literacy and numeracy development and can be accessed at https://login.iready.com/.

In preparation for administering the online assessment to Grade 3 and Grade 11 learners, the following program requirements must be strictly adhered to before the assessment period to ensure smooth and effective implementation.

For hardware requirements, schools must secure a stable and reliable internet connection with adequate bandwidth capacity to support the simultaneous access of multiple devices, particularly in a computer laboratory or similar setup. The assessment may be conducted using any of the following devices: desktop computer, laptop, Chromebook, iPad, Android tablet, or smartphone. To ensure that learners can fully engage with audio-based items and to maintain focus and audio output privacy, it is required that each learner uses a headset or earphones during the assessment.

Regarding software requirements, it is essential to conduct a system compatibility check to confirm that all devices meet the technical specifications needed for the assessment. This can be done by accessing the i-Ready System Check through this link: https://cdn.i-ready.com/systemcheck/.

### D. ASSESSMENT WINDOWS AND IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE

To ensure the effective implementation of Project INSIGHT and to fully utilize its diagnostic results in literacy and numeracy skills, a structured implementation timeline has been created for S.Y. 2025–2026. This timeline outlines key activities, assigns responsible participants, and details the schedule for each component, from project launch to administering diagnostic assessments and presenting the assessment results. These presentations will serve as opportunities to analyze learner performance, especially to identify struggling students and address their needs through targeted interventions. The timeline aims to support data-driven planning and instructional adjustments, ensuring that each assessment cycle makes a meaningful contribution to improving learning outcomes across all cities and municipalities in the region. Each participating school will be given sufficient time to complete the assessments within the designated window. Learners in Grades 3 and 11 will be allotted approximately two hours each to complete the assessments focused on literacy and numeracy skills, which aim to generate diagnostic results for identifying learning gaps and informing targeted interventions. The official schedule of schools for each assessment day, along with detailed technical instructions, will be provided in a separate advisory.

The diagnostic results shall be released via email to participating schools and their respective Schools Division Offices (SDOs). All generated data shall be handled with strict adherence to the provisions of the Data Privacy Act of 2012, ensuring that learner information is protected and used solely for educational improvement purposes. Access to individual and school-level results shall be limited to authorized personnel and shall not be disclosed or disseminated beyond intended recipients without proper consent and safeguards.

Assessment Results Presentations will be conducted in the week immediately following each assessment window. These sessions will serve as venues for school leaders and instructional staff to analyze learner performance data, identify trends, and design evidence-based interventions for classroom and school-level improvement.

### E. Roles and Responsibilities

### 1. Regional Core Team

The team, which includes the CLMD Chief, Education Program Supervisors from the Curriculum and Learning Management Division, and an Education Program Supervisor from the Policy, Planning, and Research







Division, will oversee and guide the overall implementation of the project. They will ensure its alignment with curriculum frameworks, assessment reforms, and learning recovery initiatives. The team will lead internal coordination and external engagement with service providers, develop the project design and technical tools, and supervise training, monitoring, and reporting activities. They will also provide technical assistance, compile implementation data, and recommend improvements to ensure the project's sustainability and ongoing development.

### 2. Schools Division Core Team

At the Schools Division level, the Chief of the Curriculum and Instruction Division (CID), together with the designated focal persons in Literacy and Numeracy, shall align existing division programs, projects, and activities with the diagnostic results of Project INSIGHT to ensure targeted interventions that address the current learning needs of the learners. They, together with other supervisors, shall monitor the implementation of the project in participating schools and provide technical assistance during school-, division-, regional-, or national-led initiatives aimed at improving learning outcomes. Their active coordination and instructional leadership shall help translate assessment data into meaningful, evidence-based actions that support learner progress.

### 3. School Core Team

Participating schools must ensure the full preparation and readiness of all Grade 3 and Grade 11 learners taking the I-Ready online assessment as part of the Project INSIGHT initiative. This includes ensuring that the infrastructure, learners, and staff are ready, setting up designated testing areas, and verifying that devices and internet connections are functioning properly for all learners involved. School heads, alongside the school testing coordinator, should oversee the administration of assessments, strictly follow testing protocols, and provide on-site technical support during the testing period. Schools should also actively use the diagnostic assessment results to guide instruction, develop targeted interventions for struggling learners, and improve literacy and numeracy outcomes. They must participate in relevant training and feedback sessions and facilitate post-assessment planning to apply appropriate strategies based on the data. By leveraging insights from Project INSIGHT, schools are expected to lead efforts in boosting learner performance through targeted, evidence-based instructional adjustments and support strategies.







### **VII. MONITORING AND EVALUATION**

Functional Division Chiefs and Education Program Supervisors from the Regional Office shall oversee and monitor the implementation of Project INSIGHT during the assessment period. This shall be carried out using the prescribed monitoring tool attached to this Memorandum (see Enclosure No. 3) to ensure fidelity of implementation and gather valuable insights for improvement. Similarly, Schools Division Offices (SDOs) shall conduct monitoring in all participating schools within their respective cities and municipalities.

All SDOs must consolidate their monitoring findings and submit a comprehensive report to **clmd.ro3@deped.gov.ph** within one week after the assessment period ends. These reports will serve as important references for evaluating the project's overall progress and for planning the necessary technical assistance and ongoing improvements.
