



Each participating school will select one (1) representative to compete in the Scouts' Elemental Pageant. The goal is to promote environmental awareness, creativity, and the values of scouting through a themed presentation centered around the four classical elements: Water, Air, Land, and Fire. Costume and Headdress: Each representative will model an outfit and headdress that artistically represents their assigned element. The costume and headdress must be crafted primarily from recyclable or reusable materials. Designs should be creative, symbolic, and environmentally conscious, capturing the essence of the element. Question and Answer Portion: As part of the event, each contestant will participate in a Question and Answer (Q&A) portion. Guidelines for Yell

- All participants from each district/municipality must perform a yell within their designated area.
- Duration must not exceed one (1) minute.
- Costumes and props reflecting the assigned tribe element (Air, Fire, Water, or Earth) are encouraged.
- The yell does not need to align with the event's environmental theme.
- Time Penalty: A 5-point deduction will be applied for every 10 seconds exceeded.

Guidelines for Unity Dance (Junior)

- Each district will present a Unity Dance performance using the song "Kalikasan"
 by Majarlica.
- Performances must not exceed one (1) minute and thirty (30) seconds in duration.
- The official choreography is attached at the end of this circular for reference and practice.

Costume and Props

- Participants are encouraged to wear themed costumes and use props that reflect nature and environmental values.
- All costumes and props must be:
 - o Safe and appropriate
 - Should not obstruct movement or visibility during the performance

Important Reminder

 Once the performance begins, all practice must stop, and everyone is expected to watch and observe respectfully.

Guidelines for Unity Dance (Senior and Cadet)

- All participants will take part in an on-the-spot Unity Dance activity.
- Girl leaders will teach the dance steps to the group.
- Participants will be given enough time to practice after the demonstration.

 Note: Once the final performance begins, all practice must stop and everyone must watch respectfully.

Guidelines for Arts and Crafts (Penholder Making)

- Participants are required to create a penholder measuring 12 inches in height,
 using a maximum of 100 strips of recycled paper.
- Each district will select and submit two (2) finished penholders to represent them.
- The penholder must be functional and sturdy.
- Participants may use additional eco-friendly materials (e.g., twine, dried leaves, scrap fabric) for decoration.
- Refer to the attached photo at the end of this document for sample design.

Guidelines for Eco-Pageant

- Costumes must be made of recycled, upcycled, or sustainable materials (e.g., paper, plastic, old fabric, dried leaves, bottles, cans, cardboard).
- Outfits must allow contestants to walk and perform confidently without risk of injury.
- No use of hazardous or harmful materials (e.g., sharp metals, fire, toxic substances).
- Respect and sportsmanship must be maintained throughout the competition.
- Costumes should be made only within the allotted time during the event.


