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Project Pitching Guidelines

Reminders:

1. SLIDE COUNT & CONTENT PER SLIDE IS NON-NEGOTIABLE. You must be able to discuss the content noted on each slide.
2. Be mindful that each group is limited to a 5-minute presentation.
3. The Division Federated SSLG Officers will provide a template of the Project Pitching Presentation.
4. The project of your choice must be one of the Core Values of the Department of Education, namely, Maka-Diyos, Maka-Tao, Maka-Kalikasan, and Maka-Bansa. It must also cater to the whole Schools Division Office of Bataan.
5. All groups must provide a soft copy of the presentation in video format.
6. All videos must be submitted on September 5, 2025. The panel will select 10 groups, and the chosen groups will then present at Hinirang Camp.

In your Presentation, it must have:

- The project title and the school you are from.
- Project Introduction & Background: How and why did your project come to be? Was there any problem or issue you wanted to address in your community? What motivated your group to start the project?
- Objectives of the Project: What would you like to achieve through this project? Preferably, use the SMART objectives.
- Creativity & Innovation: What activities and/or methods are you planning to pursue to achieve your objectives? How unique and innovative would your project be from existing projects or initiatives that are similar in theme or problem that you are addressing?
- Impact of the Project: How do you think your project can influence your target community's perception, behavior, and even way of life, especially about the problem that you are addressing?
- Community Engagement: Who is your target audience? How do you think they can benefit from your project? How would you like to keep your community and stakeholders engaged, mobilized, and involved in your project?
- Replicability: How replicable do you think this project would be to be done in various schools across our SDO? In other words, how would you envision this project to be continuously implemented not only in your school, but in others as well?



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- Closing Statement: It can be quotes from your beneficiaries, teachers, favorite philosophers, or it can be from yourself. As long as it is impactful, make yourselves memorable to the panel.

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Title: HINIRANG CAMP: KaBATAANG Leaders: Kuwento ng Hinirang
Guidelines:

1. Genre Assignment - Each group will randomly select one genre (Adventure, Drama, Romantic Comedy, Suspense, Horror, or Tragedy) to apply in their short film.
2. Theme Connection - Your film must highlight youth leadership, empowerment, and nation-building, reflecting the theme of Hinirang Camp 2025.
3. Video Duration - Films must be between 4 and 5 minutes long, filmed in landscape orientation, and saved in MP4 format.
4. Shooting Schedule - Filming must be done on the time and date assigned by the Event Coordinators. No rescheduling allowed. (Day 1 of Hinirang Camp)
5. Team Participation - All members must be involved in any of the following roles: acting, scriptwriting, directing, editing, or design. No outside help.
6. Creativity Counts - Be original! Use your assigned genre creatively and show effort in storytelling, props, and visuals.
7. Groupings - The groupings on the Project Pitching Challenge will not be applicable in this activity. Kwento ng Hinirang will have different groupings.
8. No Outsourcing - Only group members should appear and work on the film. No external actors or borrowed edits allowed.
9. Submission Deadline - Submit your final video on or before the deadline given by the organizers. Late entries = minus points.
10. Rules Must Be Followed - No plagiarism, vulgar content, or off-theme entries. Violations may lead to disqualification.
11. Respect the Judges' Decision - All scoring is final and based on official criteria. Judges' decisions are to be respected.
