## **GLOBAL HANDWASHING DAY CELEBRATION 2025**

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Chief Education Supervisors Education Program Supervisors Public Schools District Supervisors Public Elementary School Principals All Others Concerned

- 1. In celebration of the Global Handwashing Day, a worldwide campaign observed annually on October 15, the Schools Division Office of Bataan will conduct a simultaneous handwashing activity. The theme for this year's celebration is "Unite for Universal Hand Hygiene." The primary goal is to promote the simple yet life-saving practice of handwashing with soap and water to prevent the spread of diseases and to foster a culture of hygiene among young learners.
- 2. All public schools are hereby enjoined to conduct a Synchronized Handwashing Activity on October 15, 2025 at 9:00 am involving all Kindergarten to Grade 3 Learners. This specific focus aims to instill good hygiene and hygiene habits at an early age.
- 3. All public schools are directed to ensure the following:
  - a. use of soap and clean water during the activity; and
  - b. teachers to supervise and provide instructions on the proper handwashing technique, including scrubbing for at least twenty seconds.
- 4. School Heads are responsible for documenting the activity.
  - a. a brief narrative report on the conduct of the activity;
  - b. photographs or a short video clip showing the learners participating; and
  - c. submission of the report to the School Governance and Operation Division (SGOD) – School Health and Nutrition (SHN) Unit through the email address <u>shnbataan@gmail.com</u> by October 22, 2025.
