1. This Office announces the conduct of the Division Search for the 2026 Gawad Pag-gabay: Pag-pupugay sa Gurong Taga-hubog, Punong-Guro, at Bayaning Mag-aaral.
2. The Gawad Pag-gabay aims the following:
 - a) Recognize and appreciate the outstanding performance, accomplishments, and significant contributions of school heads, teacher-advisers, student leaders, and learner formators in implementing relevant and responsive learner formation programs contributing to the delivery of accessible and quality basic education for all and learners' holistic development;
 - b) Encourage and motivate learner program implementers to plan and implement significant learner formation programs, projects, and activities responsive to addressing the pressing issues concerning today's learner; and,
 - c) Sustain and promote high-impact learner formation programs, projects, and activities that lead learners to become agents of change and responsible citizens.
3. The Learner Formation Programs, Projects, and Activities implemented/accomplished from June 2025 to January 2026 shall only be considered for the 2026 Gawad Pag-Gabay Search.
4. The Teacher Advisers and School Heads of the winners of the Most Outstanding Student Leaders award from each school will receive the same award.



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5. All entries must be submitted in hard copy to the Schools Division Office of Bataan, Kabukiran, Calaylayan, Abucay, Bataan on or before February 2, 2026. Late submissions will not be accepted, so participants are advised to ensure that all documents are completed and submitted on time.
6. The awarding ceremony shall be held during the Graduation and Recognition Ceremony in the respective schools of the awardees.
7. The Search is open to all public elementary and secondary schools, school heads, teacher-advisers, student leaders, learner-led clubs, Division Leadership, the Advocacy and Campaign Development, and Division Federated Learner Government Programs that are excellently implementing the Learner Formation Flagship Programs.
8. All expenses incurred by the participants and the search committee in conducting this search shall be charged against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
