The correlation between teacher ethics and professional identity has garnered significant attention. Dizon and Mercado (2023) contend that comprehending and assimilating the Code of Ethics enhances professionalism and accountability. When educators connect their behaviors with ethical principles, they acquire both credibility and personal fulfillment in their profession.
