The impact of educational leadership on school performance is evident in multiple dimensions, including academic results, teacher effectiveness, and school climate. For example, a 2025 study found a significant positive correlation between transformational leadership and secondary school performance, highlighting that leaders who set clear goals and support teachers directly influence learning outcomes (Contemporary Journal, 2025). Additionally, research in the Philippines revealed that leadership styles significantly affect teacher motivation, which in turn impacts student engagement, retention, and overall school effectiveness (OAPUB, 2023). School climate, including inclusivity, safety, and support, is also shaped by leadership. Leaders who foster a positive climate create an environment where students are more likely to participate

actively in learning, demonstrating that leadership extends beyond administrative tasks to the cultivation of holistic student development (EduPIJ, 2025).

Student success, which encompasses academic performance, engagement, motivation, and personal growth, is closely linked to the quality of leadership. Democratic and participatory leadership styles, which involve shared decision-making and empowerment of teachers and students, have been shown to enhance student achievement by creating ownership and accountability for learning outcomes (EJES, 2024). Effective educational leaders also prioritize instructional quality by providing resources, guidance, and feedback to teachers, supporting professional development, and implementing strategic initiatives that align with curricular goals. These practices strengthen teacher performance, which directly translates into improved student outcomes, demonstrating the mediating role of teachers in the relationship between leadership and student success (MDPI, 2022).

Despite the clear benefits of effective leadership, challenges remain in preparing and supporting school leaders to meet the complex demands of modern education. Continuous professional development, mentorship, and policy support are essential to ensure that leaders can sustain positive impacts on schools and students. In conclusion, recent research consistently highlights that educational leadership plays a central role in enhancing school performance and student success.
