- conduct of advocacy campaigns and information dissemination;
- classroom-based discussions on TB awareness and prevention;
- posting of IEC (Information, Education, Communication) materials;
- encouraging early health-seeking behavior; and
- coordination with local health units for TB screening activities, where feasible

Schools are advised to document their activities and submit a brief report with photos to the Schools Division Office through the SGOD/School Health Section on or before **March 23, 2026**.


Specifically, schools may be encouraged to:

**SUBJECT: Commemoration of World TB Day 2026**

The Philippines continues to face a significant burden of tuberculosis (TB), with an estimated **625/100,000** new TB cases reported annually based on the 2025 Global TB Report. This underscores the urgent need for sustained efforts through a whole-of-government and whole-of-society approach to control and eliminate the disease.

World TB Day is observed every **March 24** to raise public awareness on TB risk factors, signs and symptoms, preventive measures, and the importance of early diagnosis and proper treatment. This year, the Department of Health (DOH) will commemorate World TB Day 2026 with the theme:

*"YES! PILIPINAS CAN #ENDTB: Magpasuri, Magpaganot, at Mag-TPTado para Protektado"*

A key highlight of this year's observance is the **Light Up PH for TB!** campaign, where national landmarks, government buildings, health facilities, schools, and workplaces are called to illuminate in **RED** on March 24, 2026 at 6:00 PM as a powerful visual symbol of solidarity in the fight against TB.

In this regard, all are encouraged to join the commemoration of World TB Day 2026. The **Light Up PH for TB! campaign shall be conducted on March 24, 2026 at 6:00 PM** as the official synchronized national illumination activity, while **all other related activities may be implemented anytime within the month of March 2026**, as applicable:

**IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES ON THE SCHOOL CALENDAR AND ACTIVITIES  
FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 2024-2025**

To: Undersecretaries  
Assistant Secretaries

1. The Department of Education (DepEd) issues the enclosed **Implementing Guidelines on the School Calendar and Activities for the School Year (SY) 2024-2025** to enable schools and community learning centers (CLCs) to effectively and efficiently implement school activities and maximize instructional time in cognizance of the goals and objectives of the MATATAG Agenda.
2. In accordance with Republic Act (RA) No. 7797, also known as An Act to Lengthen the School Calendar from Two Hundred (200) Days to Not More Than Two Hundred Twenty (220) Class Days, as amended by RA 11480, An Act Amending Section 3 of Republic Act No. 7797, which provides that the school year shall start on the first Monday of June but not later than the last day of August, the SY 2024-2025 shall formally open on Monday, **July 29, 2024**, and end on Tuesday, **April 15, 2025**, including the Midyear Break and End-of-School Year (EOSY) Rites.
3. Private schools, state/local universities and colleges (SUCs/LUCs) may adopt these omnibus implementing guidelines on the school calendar and shall follow the provisions stipulated under RA 11480 concerning the required number of class days and the opening of the SY. Schools shall report any inevitable deviation from these guidelines in advance to their respective regional offices (ROs).
4. All DepEd Orders and other related issuances inconsistent with this Order are repealed or modified accordingly.
5. This Order shall take effect upon its approval, issuance, and publication on the DepEd website. Certified copies of this Order shall be registered with the Office of the National Administrative Register (ONAR) at the University of the Philippines Law Center (UP-LC), UP Diliman, Quezon City.
