**CONTINUED IMPLEMENTATION AND EXPANSION OF ACHIEVE 3000 AS A SUPPLEMENTARY LEARNING RESOURCE FOR GRADES 7 AND 8**

1. In support of the Department of Education's thrust to strengthen literacy and reading comprehension among learners, and in alignment with reading initiatives such as the **Bawat Bata Bumabasa (3Bs Initiative)**, all concerned are hereby informed that the utilization of Achieve 3000 as a supplementary learning resource for Grade 7 students shall continue until May 2026.
2. In addition, the implementation of Achieve 3000 is hereby expanded to include Grade 8 learners, as part of the Division's intensified efforts to improve reading proficiency, vocabulary development, and critical thinking skills across the Junior High School level. All secondary schools are therefore directed to ensure the inclusion of Grade 8 learners in the program implementation.
3. This initiative is anchored on the provisions of DepEd Order No. 21, s. 2019 (Policy Guidelines on the K to 12 Basic Education Program) and other related issuances that promote the use of appropriate instructional interventions to improve learners' literacy outcomes.
4. Schools are hereby directed to ensure the consistent, purposeful, and effective use of the Achieve 3000 platform to maximize learner engagement and achievement.
5. Teachers are likewise enjoined to:
  - a. Regularly monitor learners' progress through the platform;
  - b. Provide appropriate remediation and enrichment activities based on learners' performance; and
  - c. Integrate Achieve 3000 activities into their daily or weekly lesson plans, as applicable.
